
# SPIDER 'DUETTO'

This marks the 50th Launch Anniversary of the Giulia 1600 Spider 'Duetto'. The car was released at the 36th Geneva Motor Show in March 1966 and together with the Giulia Sprint Veloce, was tested by the press at an event organised in Gardone Riviera. To choose a name for the new convertible, Alfa Romeo announced a write-in competition, offering an example of the new car as a prize. Over one hundred thousand ballots were sent



in, the great majority from Italy; the winner was Guidobaldo Trionfi, a man from Brescia, who proposed the name Duetto. However the Duetto name could not be officially adopted due to trademark issues, and the car was named simply Alfa Romeo Spider 1600. The Spider's 1,570 cc twin-cam engine had dual Weber two-barrel side-draft carburetors, and produced 109 PS DIN 108 hp; or 129 PS SAE). Sparsely fitted inside but including five speed manual transmission and disc brakes, the price on launch in Italy was 2,195,000 lire. To celebrate this special anniversay, I am proposing to feature these early cars at our major events during this coming season, with hopefully, some additional stand-alone themed activities for all 105 Spiders owners to participate and enjoy.
